Introduction

The present catalogue contains 818 publications on malacology and conchology. 818 books and magazines worth compiling. But what exactly makes these publications attractive, even desirable? It is evident. Sometimes.

For instance, some of the books in this catalogue are illustrated by the best natural history illustrators, if not the best artists of their times.

The Gautier d'Agoty family, led by Jean Fabien Gautier d'Agoty "Agoty Père" (1716-1785) was the first to use 4 colour printing in scientific illustration, in particular the visualization of the human anatomy. But their skills went further. That is shown, paradoxically, in their simpler engravings, such as the rendering of a scallop, or a cluster of barnacles [no. 196 Faujas]. Their work, although creatively restricted by the technique used, has a powerful realism that seems miles away from the simple, often naïve illustrations of their contemporaries. Compare, for instance, the charming, but not quite accurate engravings in Klein [no. 332].

Scientific illustration precludes the approach of a Monet, or Picasso. Jean Prêtre was the absolute master of accuracy, in colour and shape, in texture and in shading. Anyone who has tried knows that the gastropod shell is among the most difficult three-dimensional objects to copy on paper. Prêtre, working nearly a century after d'Agoty, made it look easy. No wonder he was among the most prolific conchological illustrators of his time, if not of all times. Examples of his work are found in Duclos [no. 176], Kiener [no.'s 322-328], and A. d'Orbigny [no. 459].

Drawing, engraving and colouring are the more obvious expressions of creative genius and outstanding craftsmanship. Accurate printing is another. Especially when done in colour.

The 19th century was the century of experimentation. We now use the prevailing printing techniques. All others have been weeded-out in Darwinian fashion: too expensive, too complicated, too risky. A certain Mister Raymond created some of the most beautiful, soft but rich colours and shades. Unfortunately his printing-process was too complicated to become commonplace.

Apart from the book of Chenu [no. 112], limited to part I of the work, we only see an example of this fine printing technique in Moquin-Tandon's. "Histoire naturelle des mollusques terrestres et fluviatiles de France" [no. 425].

Agouty Père proclaimed that for an accurate colour image 4 colours were necessary. But why limit yourself to what is necessary? Additional colours may create a subtlety and "depth" or "warmth" that help to give an image a super-realistic feel, a subtle exaggeration that changes an image into a something more real, an almost tangible object.

The art of multi-colour printing has not been mastered as well as by the Japanese. "Seashells of the Sagami Bay" [no. 338] may be the ultimate example of six colour printing; the additional colours are exceptionally useful in recreating on paper the delicate iridescence of mother-of-pearl.

Other works with plates of similar artistic beauty are Kira Habe and HabeKira's "Shells of the western Pacific in colour" [no. 331] and, more recently, Okutani's "Marine shells of Japan" [no. 448]. The beauty of these works is a joy forever indeed.

Others books may not be that exceptionally well illustrated but what makes them outstanding is the novelty of the ideas presented, and the amazing discoveries revealed.

The period of Enlightenment has brought Man three "deep" discoveries that help humans to understand his place in nature: deep time, deep space, and, first of all, deep dimensions. In the 17th century, the primitive telescopes revealed worlds bigger than ours. In the same century, microscopes, as invented and built by Anthonie van Leeuwenhoek, and used by for instance Francesco Redi, Robert Hooke, and Jan Swammerdam, showed us worlds much smaller than ours. Swammerdam and Leeuwenhoek concentrated their attention on microbes and insects. Later Dutch followers, like the Zeelanders Job Baster (1711-1775) [item 37] and Martinus Slabber (1740-1835) [item 591] turned their attention towards the marine animals in the Zeeland waters, including small molluscs.

Lyell discovered deep time. Before him, the biblical catastrophism theories were universally accepted. An almighty God terminated his experiments with huge floods, killing all the animals whose remnants were being excavated from mountainsides and riverbeds. These gigantic floods happened suddenly, fast, and quite recently. Lyell [no. 395] partly based his ideas on the palaeontological researches, in particular on molluscs, of Gérard Paul Deshayes. He argued that the history of the earth was a gradual one, and must have taken much longer than previously thought. For Charles Darwin this later proved to be essential to his evolution theory.

But the importance of an idea is not only determined by how right it proved to be. You can be magnificently wrong.

Gessner's aim was to bring together in one book all living creatures known to man. But in his time, more was unknown, or half-known. His book [no. 237], therefore, shows a strange mix of truly existing fish, mammals, squids and shells, and mythical creatures only seen by half-drowned and dehydrated sailors.

De Montfort's fascination for octopi and their kind is evident from his work [no. 160]. The "Histoire naturelle", advertised as a work on Mollusca in general, skews much more into the direction of the fastest, most intelligent, and most mysterious of the Mollusca – the cephalopods. Their unfathomed diversity, size, and power tickled de Montfort's imagination from scientific accuracy to beyond the wildest dreams of B-film directors of the past century, culminating in the image of the gigantic "Kraaken" that could engulf a whole merchantman and drag it down to the bottom of the ocean. Only centuries later squids of nearly ten metres from tip to toe (or, rather, tentacle) were regularly caught in the depths of the oceans.

A sheer boundless imagination surely does have its admirable sides.

And sometimes it is just the monumental perseverance and meticulousness in discovering and describing little details that often started to show their significance in sciences such as ecology, ontology, phylogeny and evolution itself, long, long after the oblivious researcher passed away.

In the 18th and 19th centuries, sons of wealthy citizens had three options, but no choice. The oldest took over the family business, the second son went into the military. And the third became a Minister. The latter two occupations guaranteed lots of idle moments. The study of nature, in all its grandeur and trifling details, became a popular pastime. Shells were collected, compared, described, and illustrated as if the world depended upon this. Two true masters of detail were the reverend Robert Boog Watson, and his colleague of Challenger fame, Edward Allen Smith [no. 594]. Their accuracy in describing and figuring, without the aid of photography, let alone Scanning Electron Micrography, has remained unsurpassed. We now, over 130 years later, look at their descriptions, their figures, the shell they had before them, and we see what they saw. And we know that we know it was there, then. The palaeontologist Steve Gould once (1996) lamented, "If Christopher Columbus had only picked up (and properly labeled, of course) a single shell of my favorite

had only picked up (and properly labeled, of course) a single shell of my favorite animal, the land snail Cerion – and they are so common that he was probably kneeling on one anyway! – I would know for sure where he had landed." An as accurate drawing of this shell as those in the Challenger volumes surely would have been sufficient as well.

Pushing forward the borders of the unknown never comes easy. A bright mind, and hard work are quintessential. But sometimes disasters, hardship, and poverty had to be overcome too. And yet the results show little or nothing of this, which makes the works truly remarkable. Not only as works of art, or science, or even both, but as examples of human versatility, perseverance, and undauntedness.

Georg Everhardus Rumphius went blind. He lost his collections in a fire, he died. And yet he produced one of the most outstanding and influential publications in the whole history of malacology, the "Amboinsche Rariteitkamer" [no. 551], a work magnificent in its richness, with thousands of new facts and ideas on nature, all collected on a tiny island, half a world away from Europe, and still the subject of, and inspiration for, new researches on bio-diversity.

Another hero of the wilderness is Thomas Say. Say taught himself to think and act scientifically. As one of the founders of the Academy of Natural Sciences of Philadelphia he helped to create scientific thinking and acting out of nothing. And when he had reached this goal, he moved to the natural, physical, and social wilderness of frontier Indiana to produce the best, most original and best illustrated work on American conchology [no. 565]. Drawn by himself and some close friends, coloured by his wife, and printed by the only, primitive, press west of civilisation. it could not have been bettered in Philadelphia. Our item is one of only a few dozen copies known to be completed.

And yet this is not all. Sure, books tell stories. Even between the lines. But former owners tell stories too: who was connected to who? Which scientist has been influ-

enced by which other scientist? Which people owned and used these books, 10, 50, 200 years ago? It is in the bookplates, the inscriptions, the dedications, and the annotations that even more fascinating tales are told. A book then becomes more than a mindless conveyor of ideas, it becomes an individual itself. It suddenly and instantly has a history, a unique place in the grand scheme of things. It has a acquired a soul.

In the works gathered in this catalogue we see a true who's who of malacology. We do not only feel the presence of great men and women of science in their printings but also in their writings. We see the inscriptions, the autographs, the dedications, the humble words of kindness and encouragement that not only define the person behind the scientist, but also bring them closer to us – we hold the very same copy in our hands that once were in theirs, bridging gaps of many decennia if not centuries [e.g. no. 183, Dupuy].

In the mid-19th century, the Sowerby family almost single-handed shaped malacology. They bought the new and rare species, described the species, figured the species and sold the species, as well as the magazines and the books about them. Guido Poppe [no. 2, 5, 9, etc.] is a modern day Sowerby. With the emphasis on modern. He does what the Sowerby's did – and much more. Out in the Philippines, arguably the richest malacological grounds on earth, he and his family and co-workers meticulously gather specimens, but what is more, they gather data on habitats and niches, on vertical and geographical distribution, on behaviour, on diversity, anomalies, and much, much more. And these findings are shared with the whole malacological community. In this catalogue we offer part of Guido's malacological library. Today, his autograph in a book may be regarded as a quality stamp; tomorrow it will be part of the great malacological heritage.

And this, inevitably, evokes the question: Will your name be written on the first blank of one of the books in this catalogue?

Finally, today, late in the year 2008, a new dimension, apart from the obvious aesthetic and scientific values, becomes apparent. More and more people recognize in these books an economical value. In times when stocks and bonds, and even real estate, have lost much of their once and long-time financial reliability, antiquarian books, like all art, continue to be seen as a sound and solid investment. It is easy to see why: not only because this is just a self-fulfilling prophecy, with more and more people (in what will be an ever more affluent and more populated world) fighting over the same desirable pieces, but also because the number of really outstanding books is gradually if not steadily diminishing due to the perennial hazards that threaten everything of beauty: the fires, the water, the ignorance, and the carelessness of those who don't know.

No doubt the next pages will bring the reader a new yet well-known excitement. Because all that has been written here is not new. Just flip through the pages and you will immediately find that, indeed, you do know.

A note on the use of the word "copy".

Throughout this catalogue, a single book, or magazine issue, is referred to as a "copy". This should never be read as "photocopy". Books and papers in photocopy are not sold by us. Only occasionally, when a publication is not complete, a single, or a few leaves (or a single volume in an otherwise complete magazine run) are added in photocopy. This is always emphasised in the description.

A note on Brachiopoda.

No phylum has as long shared common attention with the Mollusca as the brachiopods. The more than superficial likeness, the sharing of many habitats, the near simultaneous appearance in the palaeontological records, the relatively small number of living taxa – it has all contributed to the fact that many a malacologist became a "brachiopodologist" too. And for a conchologist the separation seems trivial indeed. No wonder that many papers in this catalogue contain information on Brachiopoda. If interested, see the 22 items listed below. American seashells. New York, NY, Van Nostrand, 1954. 4to, 555 pp., 40 coloured plates and numerous figs. Cloth. Coloured front of dust jacket preserved. €25 Although often considered inferior to the 1974 second edition, the first edition of American seashells does have the advantage of providing chapters on "Life of the mollusks", "Collecting American mollusks", "Man and Mollusks", and quite a few illustrations lacking in the 2nd edition. All this makes it a perfect companion to the 2nd edition. This is the first printing of the first edition of this important book.

2. Abbott, R. T.

American seashells, 2nd Edition. New York, NY, Van Nostrand Reinhold, 1974. 4to. 663 pages, about 4,000 text figs, 24 coloured plates. Original green cloth with gilt lettering. €230

Second and best edition of this important handbook. Lists all 6,500 known species of marine molluscs living in the waters adjacent to North America, from the Arctic sea to Baja California, the Gulf of Mexico and south to Brazil. Over 3,000 species are illustrated (often from type figures) and described in detail. Very good copy, some wear to top and bottom of spine, internally clean. With authors dedication to Jean Cremer, and ex-owner's entry of Guido Poppe – another important author on molluscs.

Charles Baker Adams's largest and most important paper. It is the first paper entirely on the Mollusca of the Pacific side of Panama, their localities ("habitats") and habitats ("stations"). It contains the descriptions, in English, of 517 species, many of which are new. The last 21 pages, titled: "Specierum novarum conchyliorum, in sinu panamensi repertorum, synopsis", contain the Latin descriptions of all the new species. Uncut, partly unopened. Rare.

Some shelfwear, but still an attractive binding.

Later half calf with raised bands, gilt lettering and marbled boards. €350

A very nice and surprisingly scarce work by one of the greatest American zoologists, Alexander Emanuel Agassiz (Neuchâtel 1835 – Atlantic Ocean 1910) on the geology and zoology of the Bahamas and Cuba. Agassiz made a fortune in mining and spent another one on the Museum of Comparative Zoology of Harvard that was founded by his father, the (also) Swissborn palaeontologist and ichthyologist Louis Agassiz (1807-1873). Alexander died en route to New York from Southampton. This paper was published in the Museum's Bulletin series. With two fine coloured foldout maps and numerous uncoloured detail maps of bays, peninsulas, etc. The photographs are mostly of coastal scenes and reefs.

One of the rarer works by the famous Ulysse Aldrovandi, with beautiful large woodcut figures of shells, crustaceans and zoophytes. This book was among the earliest works to focus on shells in such detail. It was the last addition to Aldrovandi's enormous zoological encyclopaedia, edited and published posthumously by Aldrovandi's widow Francesca. Outer margin of the title page folded. A rare ensemble of the two publications on the Alert voyage, together being all zoological results published. It is very rare to find the 1884 book together with the 1881 article from the Proceedings of the Zoological Society. This article gives the results of the investigations that were carried out in the Magellan strait and Patagonia, regions which were not covered in the 1884 book. This 1884 title deals with the surveys around and on Pacific and Indian Ocean islands. Contains: Summary of the voyage by R.W. Coppinger, Mammalia by O. Thomas (this section describes skulls of Torres Straits and Banks Islanders), Aves by Sharpe, reptiles, batrachians and Pisces by Guenther, molluscs by E.A. Smith. (83, 22, 23 pp., and 4, 1, 3 plates), Echinodermata by Bell, crustaceans by Miers, Coleoptera by Waterhouse, Lepidoptera by Butler, Alcyonaria and sponges by Ridley. 54 nice plates. The well-preserved fauna is probably of Oligocene or Miocene age.

Contains many new species and in contrast to many other works by Bourguignat it is well-illustrated. Dance, "shell collecting", calls Jules-René Bourguignat the "Bête noir" in French conchology or the "practice of species-mongering represents an unsavoury aspect of systematic conchology in the 19th century". This is the complete first volume, with its own title page. Two more centuries of a second volume have been published but are not included. Some front wrappers inscribed by the author to De Saulcy. Louis Félicien Joseph Caignart De Saulcy (1807-1880) was a French archaeologist, numismatician and malacologist. Uncut, partly unopened. Some foxing mostly in the text. As most of Bourguignat's papers only published in 100 copies, therefore a set like this, published over quite a long period, is very rare. Caprotti, p. 175; Nissen ZBI, 506.



Jean Boussac (1885-1916) was professor of geology. His promising career ended at the battle of Verdun. Boussac is perhaps best known for his first thesis, dealing with the stratigraphy of the Alpine (Nummulitic) Eocene which was published in 4to format, but this second thesis may be more important from an evolutionary point of view, especially with regard to the Palaeogene (in particular Lutetien – Auversien – Bartonien) Cerithioidea. In the rear a short appendix dealing with the evolution of the bivalve genus Chama. Bookplate removed from front paste-down, rather weak dampstain to the corners of the first three plates, otherwise a fine (and beautifully bound) copy. There is a scarce, much inferior 1978 reprint but this is the very rare original edition.

Only a few plates show nummulites. Most of the shells are fairly well-preserved, and many are here described as new. A well-bound copy of this important publication.

A table lists native, naturalised and cultivated plants on Madeira. Bowdich (1790-1824) died during the mission described in this book: his widow published his findings posthumously. Heir to a fortune in the carpet industry he could afford to spend a great deal of money on shells and conchological literature. A born collector, Dautzenberg accumulated specimens with a zeal and discernment rarely equalled; and by 1914 it was estimated that his cabinets contained thirty thousand species... with E. Bucquoy and G.F. Dollfus [he] wrote a large work on the marine molluscs of the Roussillon, South France, generally recognised as the best available account of western Mediterranean molluscs" (Dance, Hist. of Shell collecting, p.165). Some covers repaired and one replaced by photocopy, otherwise a very good copy, complete in original issues with their printed wrappers that are often discarded in bound copies. Cat. BM(NH), p. 277.

First Latin edition of the first book dealing exclusively with shells. Filippo Buonanni (1638-1725; a pupil of Athanasius Kircher) divided the shells into three classes, namely nonturbinate, turbinate and bivalved. About 500 species were illustrated on the fine engravings. The final six plates depict the famous "Archimboldo grotesques", which are heads or figures composed of shells. His table, inserted at p. 60, of colours, and his method of counting whorls, visualized on p. 219, is interesting and still causes hot debates today. The frontispiece, depicting Neptune on a shell throne and drawn by G. F. Venturini, has a minor professionally repaired tear. Title trimmed in upper margin without loss of text. One plate with a large repaired tear and two plates soiled, otherwise a nice and clean copy. According to us the frontispiece and section titles are in a 17th century hand-colouring. The plates however are probably done later and after consulting several specialists it is has become even more unclear from which date the colouring might be; some say it is contemporary or near contempo30

rary, others suggest it is from the 18th century, others again claimed it must be 19th century. Therefore it must be said it is such a difficult case that we simply do not know for sure. Nissen ZBI 754. BM(NH) Catalogue Vol. 1, p. 286.

Rare first and only edition of one of the earliest Italian treatises on microscopy. It includes 10 shell plates (with 47 shells) hitherto unpublished by this author. DSB vol. II p. 591-92 states: "Buonanni, one of the most learned Jesuits of his time, was a pupil of Athanasius Kircher, and in 1680 succeeded his master as teacher of mathematics at the Collegium Romanum; in 1698, he was appointed curator of the Kircherian Museum, which he described in his 'Museum

Collegii Romani Kircherianum' (1709). Erudite in a number of fields, including numismatics and ecclesiastical history (writing on both subjects), Buonanni made extensive studies in the natural sciences: he constructed his own microscope with three lenses (according to Tortona's system), which proved to be an ingenious mechanism for continual observation. In his 'Ricreazione dell'occhio e della mente nell'osservazione della chiocciole' (1681), a work valuable for its many illustrations of shells, he explicitly affirmed his belief in the spontaneous generation of molluscs and rekindled the controversy over generation that had flared in 1671 between Kircher and Francesco Redi". Two years after the publication of the 'Ricreazione', Antonio Felice Marsili, archdeacon of Bologna, brought out his own 'Relazione sul ritrovamen-

to dell'uova di chiocciole', in which he described and, indeed, provided drawings of the eggs of snails, some of which visibly contained minuscule snails. Redi, because of Buonanni's opposition to his conclusions on the oviparous generations of insects, harshly criticized Buonanni in his 'Osservationi' (1684), pointing out his rival's error regarding the absence of the heart in snails (the existence of which Redi demonstrated) and asserting, further, that all snails had hearts. The first part of his 'Observationes circa Viventia', the book offered here, contains Buonanni's reply to Redi and Malpighi. The second part of this work is devoted entirely to conchology with a chapter describing museums with shell collections and another providing text for the 47 illustrations of shells which follow. 'Micrographia Curiosa', the title of the final section of this work contains Buonanni's observations on early microscopes and a precise description of his own, illustrated with two copper plates. According to Clay and Court's "The history of the Microscope', Buonanni's microscope "is of particular interest as it contains for the first time the method of holding the object between two flat plates held together by a spiral spring, which arrangement was afterwards copied by Hartsoeker and all the English makers of the screw-barrel microscope". There are 131 superbly engraved numbered figures of insects used to illustrate this section, but only the first ten plates are numbered. According to the DSB, "his drawings of the Culex pipiens (common house mosquito) are the best of the seventeenth century". Most plates depict shells, insects including the famous figures 55/56 being the highly enlarged Acari (on larges, folded sheets), and some plants. The last two plates with a repair to edge on verso and some contemporary music notes on the verso of last plate. A repaired, vague library stamp on the title-page and a handwritten note in an old hand: Philippio Bonanni Soc. Jes. and Romae emit Henr. Hasporg An 1703. The 2 nice engraved frontispieces are by Lenardi and Vinient, dated Romae 1692. Nissen ZBI, 752 counts 70 plates but this may be an error since plate XIV (the first numbered) actually is the 13th plate.

The printed version was published in 1681 in 2 volumes in Rome with 2 engraved frontisp. and 109 engravings, which we also occasionally have. We once had this original manuscript too. See Dance, Shell collecting p. 20-21: "the Italian Jesuit, Philippo Buonanni wrote the first of these pioneer books on shells...". In Italian with an English summary on pp. 639-664. A fine mint copy, numbered 632 by hand. We have not seen any other copy on the internet for a long time.

with sections (a novel idea, showing the shells' inner structure). Listings of copies with only two uncoloured plates are erroneous. Contains a very interesting and useful list of "Writers on Conchology", including many names and papers that are now forgotten, but may be quite interesting nonetheless. Burrow marked each according to 11 different classes of writers, e.g. "Those who have described the shells of certain parts of the globe", and "Those who have commented on the works of others". Another unusual feature is a "Table of colours", being a bilingual list of colours used in shell-descriptions, with, where necessary, some additional information, e.g. "Ater – Black – Lamp Black; Niger – Black – Indian Ink; Nigricans – Blackish", etc.. Uncut, front board detached. As usual a bit of foxing but mainly in the text and the frontispiece (which shows multivalves); most plates are clean. On the front paste-down an old, finely engraved bookplate with a hand-written addition dated 1845. We also hold the Italian translation from 1828 in later half cloth. Caprotti, p. 179; Nissen ZBI, 769.

All fossils and minerals have a hand-coloured and engraved border in the style of Balconi and De la Rüe. Francois-Xavier Burtin was a medical doctor (1743-1818) and this is his only contribution to palaeontology including his "Vues sur la théorie de la Terre". A small inoffensive stamp on the title-page with "cession autorisée". The text is a bit wavy and the first plate slightly spotted in the margin. The man-made connection between the Red Sea and the Mediterranean has lead to the invasion of many hundreds of tropical invertebrates into the eastern Mediterranean. This book records the beginning of this process. Contributions are by M. Fox, general part including Bibliography; Mortensen on Echinoderms; Browne on Medusae; Fauvel on Annelides; Norman on fishes; Robson on Cephalopoda; Tomlin (with an appendix by Fox) on all other Mollusca, etc. This is vol. 22 of the Transactions of the Zoological Society of London. This is a part of the Bibliothèque Conchyliologique, a series of translations of rare and important British and American publications into French. It contains all the conchological papers from the Transactions of the Linnean Society of London published from the start in 1791 up to 1835, in French translation, and with new engravings. The Latin texts (in species' descriptions) are not translated. Authors include J. Adams, Montagu, Maton & Rackett, J. Sowerby, Marryat, Guilding, Jeffreys and others. There is no other compilation of these papers and the original papers are often very difficult to find.



Another interesting aspect of this book is that it specifically lists "the exotic species that have been improperly admitted to the British list". Uncut. This second edition edited by Johann-Daniel Major (1634-1693), professor of medicine at Kiel University and generally credited for the invention of infusory surgery by means of the "Chirurgia infusoria" of 1667. This edition has extensive printed annotations and additions of J. Major. It also includes a "Dictionarum Ostralogicum" at the end, a kind of dictionary on shells and their terminology, being the first of its kind. The wood-engravings of shells (mainly gastropods and bivalves) and living animals are quite good and some serve as the type-figures of species validly described in the Linnaean era and, with a few exceptions, are still identifiable to the species level today. Title written in old (contemporary) hand on spine. Rare to see all three volumes, in matching cloth bindings. The "Archeogastropoda" is the only section of the gastropods issued. It does, however, contain a full-colour plates of other, rare, gastropods (cypraeids, volutes). A fine, complete set.

Disbound. €50 In 1842, Alcide d'Orbigny (in Ramon de la Sagra, Historia fisica, politica, y natural de la isla de Cuba, tomo V, Moluscos, Atlas) first figured a strange shell with a tri-lobed aperture as Sinusigera cancellata. Today we know it represents the planktotrophic veliger stage of a Cypraea, and that similar veliger shells occur in many families, including the Ovulidae, Muricidae, and Triphoridae. This however, was all unknown to the Belgian malacologist Alfred Craven, who in 1877 happily described many new species. Today, his work is forgotten but for no good reason as his clear descriptions and good figures represent valid introductions of new names in the aforementioned families overlooked or neglected by modern students of these families. 

Georges Léopold Chrétien Frédéric Dagobert baron de Cuvier (1769-1832) was one of the foremost French geologists, palaeontologists, zoologists and comparative anatomists, and certainly the first to integrate these disciplines which resulted in his influential Règne Animal distribué d'après son Organisation pour servir de base à l'Histoire Naturelle des Animaux et d'introduction à l'Anatomie Comparée (1817, revised 1830) of which this is the first literal translation into English, with many footnotes discussing additional facts and opinions. This edition should not be confused by the near simultaneously published reworked edition of Cuvier's magnum opus, edited by Edward Griffith and Edward Pidgeon, and also known as "The Animal Kingdom". The latter is much more common. The text-parts have 1-2 engraved port (tissue-guarded Cuvier (frontis to part I), John James Audubon (at the beginning of the birds-section of part I), Linnaeus (frontis to part II), Buffon (in part II), Latreille (frontis to part III), William Kirby (frontis to part IV, and William Spence (in part IV). The subdivision of the plate volumes is as follows: I Mammals and Birds: 79 and 43 plates; II Reptiles and Fishes: 43, 153; III Mollusca, Annelides, Crustacea, Arachnides: 79, 11, 59, 50; IV Insecta, Zoophytes 121, 24. In other words, a complete copy, as called for in the plate captions and index, with two additional plates. Some scuffing to boards, and, very lightly, to spine ends. Marsh (300 pp., 49 full colour plates, and many text figs), also has a detailed folding map of San Juan Harbor, and a similar one Mayaguez Bay, Mona Islands and other localities, and one of Puerto Rico and the surrounding sea showing the collecting (dredging) stations of the Commission Steamer Fish Hawk in 1899 that were also the source of the collected molluscs. These maps are usually not present in separate copies of the Mollusca part. Also included is the general report on the investigations. A fine clean copy.

This large-paper publication was the start of what was to be a complete treatise on the marine gastropods of the world. Except for a part on Oliva, published in 1840 after a five year delay, this was all that was published. Later, Pierre Louis Duclos (d. 1853) contributed to the the series by Chenu, "Illustrations conchyliologiques ou description et figures de toutes les coquilles connues vivantes et fossiles..." which had an even grander scope but was not finished either. The first names of Duclos were a mystery for many years until the Californian malacologist Scott Jordan discovered them in a letter. His year of birth is still unknown. In accuracy of form and colour, the plates, by Prêtre, are among the best produced in the 19th century. A very good, complete set, almost without foxing (some light, marginal spotting to a few plates, some waterstaining to lower margin of a few plates, not affecting the figures. 

He also wrote some monographs of the Neue Systematisches Conchylien-Cabinet which was started by Küster in 1837 and ended in 1920. This work (based on material collected by the medical doctor Georg Tams who travelled widely through what is now Angola) is the first contribution to the malacological fauna of southwest Africa – an area little explored conchologically in the many years to follow. Only from the mid-20th century were these coasts surveyed again. Not surprisingly nearly all taxa described by Dunker were new. The text is waterstained and several plates a bit foxed in the margins. 



The absent plate 38 [Stercoraire Cataracte, des îles Malouines] concerns a bird, and plates 84 to 96 concern invertebrates. The magnificent plates are by Blanchard, Deslongchamps, Huet, Oudart, Prêtre, Prevost a.o., all of them well-known and famous artists of this period. 26 of the plates show birds, 23 fishes and six shells, and one shows shelled molluscs without the shells. The other plates show reptiles, other invertebrates etc. Large quantities of natural history specimens were brought home to Paris, many new to science. "For three years Freycinet cruised about, visiting Australia, the Marianne, Sandwich, and other Pacific islands, South America, and other places, and, notwithstanding the loss of the 'Urania' on the Falkland Islands during the return voyage, returned to France with fine collections in all departments of natural history, and with voluminous notes and drawings, which form an important contribution to the knowledge of the countries visited" (Encyclopaedia Britannica). Freycinet was clandestinely accompanied by his wife. She became the first European woman to land in Western Australia and to see many Pacific islands. Interior of wrapper partly strenghtened and a few small repairs to edges of front and back wrapper, last plate slightly frayed along outer margin. 

Froriep may have added some new genera here, but this needs further research. The title page calls for a schematic plate, but there is none, and it seems that it was never inserted in this copy. 



The Historiae animalium first appeared in 4 folio volumes printed in Zurich by Christoffel Froschouwer. A German translation, also printed by Froschouwer, followed in 1563 and was reprinted several times. This set contains the following: Thierbüch (1583, 3rd); Vogelbüch (1582, 3rd); Fischbüch (1575, 2nd); Schlangenbüch (1589, 1st); De Scorpione (1589, 1st). The Fischbüch contains invertebrates as well, including many Mollusca. It

is rare to see such a mixed set. This important work may be seen as the starting point of modern zoology. The first few leaves of the Thierbuch have been restored in the lower corner and there is a little thumbing in corners as usual in all 5 books. A few repaired tears and a vague library stamp on 2 titles. Some handwritten notes in an old hand. In the "Vogelbuch" several marginal annotations in an old hand, the last 40 ll. have a large waterstain. In all a very good and collectible set with broad margins and strong imprint of the woodcuts. The true first edition.Georg Wolfgang Knorr (1705-1767) was an engraver and publisher in Nuremberg who developed an interest in natural history. He published many engravings of fossils and tropical seashells which paired beauty and esthetics with scientific accuracy. This is Knorr's most famous work in the original German version which was later translated into Dutch and French as well. The specimens illustrated show a wide variety of almost exclusively tropical marine shells, mainly gastropods, and nearly all are identifiable to modern species levels. Of note is the large number of western Atlantic/Caribbean species, but there are even more from the Indo-Pacific. Several represent the type figures of species later formally described by others. According to Dance (p. 50) the shells are "all extremely well drawn and beautifully painted (with the exception of those on the last ten plates, published after Knorr's death, which are white on a dark ground)". This is somewhat inaccurate as Knorr died about

halfway through publication and many of his coloured plates were also published posthumously, and, as in this copy, the "white" figures may actually be tinted. Part I and II with shells from an unindicated source, Parts II, III with shells from the Muller and Schadeloock collections, Part IV with shells from the Schadeloock, Müller and Houttuijn collections; Part V and VI with shells from the Houttuijn collection, and part 6 from an unknown source – probably from Knorr's estate. 





Despite the title only mentioning birds, amphibia and fish, the Museum Frederici contains all the major vertebrate classes. In both parts many new species, from all parts of the world, were introduced. 





All major groups are present of marine mollusks, namely, aplacophorans, chitons, shell-bearing gastropods, opisthobranchs, scaphopods, bivalves, and cephalopods, including very good original photos of micro molluscs (seldom shown in conventional monographs), newly discovered species, and deep-sea species. This is the most reli-





It is quite possible that this indicates a gap in the production, the rest being published (much) later. The missing plates however, can be provided in very good scanned reproductions. Scattered, mostly light, sometimes moderate spotting, on the plates, mostly marginal. Even in an incomplete state a great rarity and very useful for identifying Cuban and Caribbean molluscs. Cat. plete in 10 parts, which this copy is - and more. There is a title page included for these parts. However, publication did not stop and after a two-year gap the four final parts were issued, also present here, but the additional section itself was never formally concluded: a separate title page to all parts, or to parts XI-XIV has never been published, nor does it seem that all additional plates called for in the text were published. The work is very important for its many new species that are all well-illustrated. Each issue is separately paginated and deals with specific animals. The title to the volume (fasciculos decem), states: "Continens quadrupedium, avium, amphibiorum, piscium, insectorum, molluscorum aliorumque marinorum." The breakdown is as follows: Part I (1767) 44 pp., 3 pls. (on antelopes); II (1767) 32 pp., 3 pls. On African mammals, and their lice; III (1767) 35 pp., 4 pls. On bats; IV (1767) 23 pp., 3 pls. On birds; V (1769) 34 pp., 5 pls, on water birds; VI (1769) 32 pp., 5 pls. On birds; VII (1769) 42 pp., 6 pls. on fish and a toad (Ranae variabilis); VIII (1770) 54 pp., 5 pls. On fish; IX (1772) 86 pp., 5 pls (1 double, folded). On insects (various orders including Lepidoptera, Coleoptera, Orthoptera, Hemiptera, Diptera, Plecoptera), and other arthropods (including crabs, spiders); X (1774) 41 pp., 4 pls (1 double, folded). On foraminifers, worms, ascidians, echinoderms, Gastropoda, and some others; XI (1776) 86 pp., 5 pls (1 double, folded); XII (1777) 71 pp., 4 plates (1 double, folding), numbered IV, V, VI, II, an antelope and an anatomy plate, numbered I and III never bound in; XIII (1779) 45 pp. There are references to plates IV-VI, none are present but according to Nissen ZBI none were issued. There are no references to plates I-III; XIV (1780) 94 pp., 4 pls. Part XI contains additions to previous parts. The 10 pp. index to parts I-X are bound before the plates of part X. The spine has been rebacked, with the original gilt-lettered red morocco label preserved. A fine clean and almost complete copy of this very rare work: the only complete copy up for during the last 30 years was at Wheldon & Wesley's (1990) in new half calf binding. Our copy only lacks two plates of deer in part 12. Usually, only fragments, in particular of the first 10 parts, are offered. The second series is extremely rare. In 1767 Pallas was invited by Catherine II of Russia to become professor at the St. Petersburg Academy of Sciences. Between 1769 and 1774 he led an expedition to Siberia, collecting natural history specimens (some of which were also described in this title). He started working on the "Spicilegia Zoologica" in 1769 in Berlin, but finished the work in St. Petersburg. This is the rare German translation of the "Spicilegia". Vague library stamp on title page. Contents very good, the coloured plates fresh and vivid. The uncoulored plates with some browning, a few more heavily uniformly age toned. This is the third very slightly edited edition (the first published in 1705, the second 1740), with the same plates as in the first. All editions are scarce. Georg Eberhard Rumphius (1628-1702) worked for the Dutch East-India Company and was stationed on the island of Ambon for most of his life. He devoted much time to research on the flora and fauna of the island. Despite disasters in his private life and the loss of his library and manuscripts in a fire, he managed to compile this great work on the natural history of tropical marine animals, with a special focus on shells. Rumphius did not live to see the published version of his book. It was published from the manuscripts he sent back to Holland in various shipments. Since most of Rumphius' drawings never arrived, the publishers commissioned Maria Sybilla Merian to draw the illustrations for the "Amboinsche Rariteitkamer". Merian had just returned from Surinam and was in financial need while she worked on her masterpiece about its insects. Needless to say, apart from being a very original work of natural history, this title also stands out for the 60 very fine plates. This copy contains the often missing portrait. 



The set contains 68 fine lithographic plates that are beautifully hand-coloured (plus 1 b/w lithographic plate), each with accompanying explanatory text. Most of the drawing and colouring is by Lucy Say and ranks among the best ever done, being far superior to that of many contemporary natural history illustrations in detail and in subtlety. The very rare "Glossary"(in less than 15 copies) is present in facsimile. It should be emphasised that the glossary is not an integral part of the American Conchology but rather meant as an incentive to the subscribers of the latter work. Perhaps Thomas Say felt that if more people became familiar with the conchological terminology then more people would appreciate his American Conchology. It was published simultaneously with part V and probably caused some confusion: some copies of the posthumously published part VII were erroneously titled part VIII. More realistically, the follow up paper published by Lucy Say in 1840 deserves to be regarded as part VIII, because, according to Mrs Say, "the following descriptions...were originally published...prior to the publication of the American Conchology, into which they were to have been copied with illustrative drawings". One more plate, apparently belonging here, was published by Binney in 1858 (the complete writings of Thomas Say, included here as a reproduction). Part VII (published after Say's death and edited by Timothy Conrad), with the original front wrapper, all the text, and the hand-coloured plates; Part "VIII" being Say's descriptions of new land shells as collected and published by Lucy Say in 1840 (first published in the Transylvania Journal, and the New Harmony Disseminator), in new wrappers, text slightly foxed, and with the single finished plate, published by W. His special interest in malacology shows in the frontispiece, which depict in full colour many types of Liguus, the tropical snail genus otherwise known only from Cuba. The book was dedicated to another conchologist, the American diplomat John Brooks Henderson (1870-1923) who also wrote extensively on Floridan and Cuban malacology. The plates are very detailed and obviously drawn with the help of a microscope, as stated in the title. The work is entirely devoted to the marine and brackish water invertebrates from Zeeland in the southwest of the Netherlands (thus: northwestern Europe), where Martinus Slabber (1740-1835) lived. It was issued over a nine-years period (with two instalments each year), and therefore complete copies, especially with the index included, are very rare. 

Preserved with 21 blind wrappers, the set contains 22 (21 numbered) papers by Souverbie and 16 numbered papers by Montrouzier (several are written by both authors), and a few smaller papers and notes, each accompanied by one plate, all but the first three hand-coloured. Missing are Souverbies papers 2, 4, 8; and Montrouzier's 2, 4, 6. Thus in all a near complete set of all the papers by both authors on the marine molluscs of New Caledonia and adjacent islands (for which the titles sometimes show some differences). Original issues of the Journal de Conchyliologie are hard to get and some of the older volumes are impossible to find. Offprints, such as the ones gathered here, are often even more scarce. Therefore it is quite unusual to see a near-complete set such as this one.

In all, Dance spent 2.5 pages of his 286 page book on the origin, contents, and sale of this collection). The last three numbered pages, placed behind the plates, form a prospectus for the "Species Conchyliorum or concise original descriptions and observations, accompanied by figures of ALL the species of Recent shells, with their varieties". This pamphet is dated January 1, 1831, and thus has been added later. The "Species Conchyliorum", although introduced here with "This day is published", had already started in 1830, but never made it beyond Vol. I, Part I. A monograph of the genus Cymba, by W. J. Broderip, and Monographs of the genera Ancillaria, Ovulum and Pandora, by Sowerby himself. Some copies of the Tankerville catalogue contain a different, 2 pp. pre-publication prospectus for the Species Conchyliorum. This copy of the Tankerville catalogue does contain the 9th plate, which seems to be often missing (fide Junk Cat. 278). Caprotti, p. 220; Not in Nissen ZBI.

It was published by Jacob Sturm (1771-1848) and continued by his son, Johann Heinrich Christian Friedrich (1805-1862). The total number of plates of this copy of the Würmer" is 116. Nissen records either 115 or (?) 118 plates. In Planorbis we lack one plate but have another not called for. The figures are of a very high standard, often showing the shell, and the animal from above and below. Several new species date from here, including the big black slug, Limax cineroniger Wolf, and several species by Hartmann. The descriptions in this part are not by Sturm who acted more as an editor, but by Wolf (Part 1, and probably 2 as well), Voith (Parts 3-4, after Draparnaud), and Hartmann (parts 5-8). Perhaps part 2 is by Sturm. Johann Wolf (1765-1824, writer of "Die Naturgeschichte der Vögel Deutschlands") is not included in the authoritive list of malacologists, "2,400 years of malacology". Quite probably Hartmann here holds the world record for "smallest hand-coloured engraving", giving highly enlarged and life-size figures of minute land snails. The following plates (each with unpaginated text leaves accompagnying the plates) and paginated texts, are present: I (1803), 16 pls; II (1806) 16; III (1813) 16; IV (1819) 15 (of 16, Planorbis spirorbis not present); V (1821) 60 pp., 3 engraved, uncoloured pls; VI (1823) 16; VII (1824) 16; VIII (1829) 18 [1-3, 4a, 4b, 5-16, 14 2nd]. Part III contains a 16 pp. booklet, titled "Systematische Eintheilung der Land- und Fluss-Weichthiere nach ihren wesentlichen Kennseichen vorzlich von der Schale (Mus Histoire naturelle des Mollusques terrstres et fluiratiles [sic!] de la France. Par Jacq. Philipp Raym. Draparnaud)". Wrappers sometimes a bit worn or (partly) split along the fold., a few spots on the wrappers, small, oval stamp on cases partly erased. The last two cases are stamped, "VI.7." and "Fauna VI.8", the others have the number and title wholly in a neat contemporary hand. The rear wrapper of part 6 double. Part 7 text uncut. 
